INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

Conditions for publishing in the *Annales*

A SGN member must be up-to-date of three years of membership fees and annual subscription to be authorized to submit a paper to the *Annales*. Each SGN member may publish a 15 page-long paper per year, free of charge [including text, illustrations and reference list — one full page of text of the *Annales* includes ca. 8200 characters and spaces]. In case of more than one author, and if at least two are SGN members (having paid their subscriptions to the Society and the *Annales*), the paper may be 20 page-long, free of charge. Each exceeding B&W page (either text or plate) is rated at 10 €, each exceeding colour page (either text or plate) is rated at 25 €.

For non-members, the number of free-of-charge pages per year is of eight (8). Each exceeding B&W page (either text or plate) is rated at 15 €, each exceeding colour page (either text or plate) is rated at 40 €.

If a submitted paper has been requested by the SGN and is over the number of allowed pages, part or whole of the extra-expenses may be paid by the Society. This is negotiable.

If necessary, help may be provided to authors who are not fully aware of publishing rules in scientific journals. For any additional question, please contact the Editor-in-chief : : didiertorz@gmail.com (Didier TORZ).

General information

The submission of a manuscript to the *Annales* implies: (i) that it is not being simultaneously offered for publication elsewhere, and (ii) that the author(s) of the paper follow(s) the "Publication policy & ethics" guidelines of the *Annales* [online: <http://sgn.univ-lille.fr/index.php?page=Publications>].

A copyright assignment form must be signed before the final acceptance, particularly in order to authorize the online publication of the papers (after a six months period of embargo). Copyright of the published papers, including illustrations, becomes the property of the journal. Requests to reproduce in great number part or whole of a paper from the *Annales* should be addressed to the Editor-in-chief.

Nomenclatural aspects of systematic (palaeontological) papers should follow the recommendations of the most recent editions of the international codes of organismal nomenclature: *International Code of Zoological Nomenclature*, *International Code of Botanical Nomenclature*, *International Code of Nomenclature of Bacteria*, virus classification (*Baltimore Classification* or *International Committee on Taxonomy of Viruses*), ...

Preservation of type specimens of fossil organisms, and other specimens which are described, figured and/or mentioned in the *Annales* papers must be registered and deposited in an appropriate public institution, either national or regional. Their collection numbers must be indicated.

The geological objects and stratigraphic sites which are described, figured and/or mentioned in the *Annales* papers must follow the *International Stratigraphic Guide* (A guide to stratigraphic classification, terminology and procedure) of the International Union of Geological Sciences: <http://www.iugs.org/>.

Projects of papers must be submitted to the Editor-in-chief before May the 15th for inclusion in the current yearly volume. Each 'manuscript' will be reviewed by at least two referees. The author may suggest to the *Annales* editorial committee the names and coordinates (e-mail, address, phone) of two referees.

Structure and format of submitted papers

'Manuscripts' (text and illustrations) are submitted by e-mail, preferably with a 'doc' or 'docx' format. Manuscripts that do not conform to the present instructions may be returned.

Structure: The text must be processed with a Times or Times New Roman font, size 12, double spaced, with margins of at least 2,5 cm, and justified at least to the left. All pages must be numbered. To

complete these instructions, please refer to a recent issue of the *Annales* [online: <https://iris.univ-lille.fr/handle/1908/32/browse>].

Papers are to be written in simple, concise and scientific French or English. They should be organized as follows [refer to the structure model that is appended to these Instructions] :

- ✓ - **TITLE IN ENGLISH**;
- ✓ - **Title in French** (exact translation);
- ✓ - First name(s) and surname(s) of author(s), followed by their full professional address(es) and e-mail(s);
- ✓ - Abstract in English, no more than 350 words long;
- ✓ - 'Résumé' in French (exact translation);
- - All audience abstract in English for half a formatted page (ca. 4000 signs and spaces);
- - 'Résumé tous publics' in French for half a formatted page (ca. 4000 signs and spaces);
- ✓ - 5 key words in English;
- ✓ - 5 'mots clés' in French (exact translation);
- ✓ - Registration in ZooBank of all nomenclatural acts (*sensu* the *International Code of Zoological Nomenclature*, 1999) published in papers of palaeontology BEFORE submission of these papers – in the *Official Registry of Zoological Nomenclature* (ZooBank) at the following URL address : www.zoobank.org (see www.iczn.org/content/about-zoobank) ; as concerned with papers of palaeobotany, authors will refer to : Knapp *et al.* 2011, Changes to publication requirements made at the XVIII International Botanical Congress in Melbourne - what does e-publication mean for you? *BMC Evolutionary Biology*, 11: 251-254 (cf. *International Code of Nomenclature for algae, fungi, and plants*).
- ✓ - Text of the article, in the following order:

I. — INTRODUCTION [centered]

1) Historical context [left justified]

a) First studies [rightly aligned]

- ✓ - At end of text, a section of acknowledgements with reference to the referees.
- ✓ - References to illustrations and/or tables in the text will be indicated as follows: (Fig. 1), (Fig. 2A-B), (Fig. 5-6), (Pl. I), (Pl. II, fig. 1a), (Tabl. 1); references to authors will be presented as follows: Dupont (1971), Dupont (2005, fig. 7), (Dupond, 1956), (Dupond, 1956, 1981), Dupont & Martin (2003), (Dupont & Martin, 2003), Dupont & Dupond (1934, p. 45);
- ✓ - Authors will suggest the desirable location of their illustrations in the text by writing the following information, **in red bold characters : [Insert here Fig. X (or Table Y) on 1 (or 2) column(s)]**
- ✓ - Each systematic description should be arranged as is usual in most palaeontological journals, that is: name of the taxon with author and date, synonymy, type material, etymology, material examined, type horizon, type locality, diagnosis, description, remarks; use nov. sp., nov. gen., nov. fam., nov. comb., etc.; use italics for names of genera and species; as much as possible, bibliographic references of the authors of taxon names must be listed in the bibliographical list;
- ✓ - Bibliographical references should be presented in alphabetical order as follows:

NAME First name initial(s), 2nd NAME First name initial(s), etc. (Year). — Title. *Journal*, **Volume** [in bold] : pages.

NAME First name initial(s), 2nd NAME First name initial(s), etc. (Year). — *Book or issue title*. Collection [eventually]; Publisher, Town : pages.

NAME First name initial(s), 2nd NAME First name initial(s), etc. (Year). — Title. *In*: NAME First name initial(s), 2nd NAME First name initial(s), etc. (ed.), *Book or issue title*. Collection [eventually]; Publisher, Town : pages.

NAME First name initial(s), 2nd NAME First name initial(s), etc. (Year). — Title. *In*: NAME First name initial(s), 2nd NAME First name initial(s), etc. (ed.), *Book or issue title*. *Journal*, **Volume** [in bold] : pages.

NAME First name initial(s) (Year). — *Thesis title*. University, Degree title (Date) : pages.

- ✓ - Captions of illustrations and tables (e.g., Fig.1. — ; Tabl. I. —), following the main text, on one or several separate pages, should include abbreviations and scale values, both in English and French.

Illustrations: Figures, tables and/or plates are provided with a 'jpeg' format with a good definition (2000 pixels wide for a vertical page). Size of figures and plates will not exceed 165 mm width x 240 mm height (for two columns), or 80 mm width x 240 mm height (for a single column). Colour illustrations may be published if a financial contribution is provided by the author(s), in agreement with rating of the printer.

Proofs: Proofs will be sent as 'pdf' files to the corresponding author, and will have to be corrected and returned in ca. two weeks.

Distribution of the *Annales* papers as 'pdf' files at the following conditions:

- if the first author is a SGN member, the pdf is free of charge, subject to the payment by the author of expenses in case of papers of more than 15 pages- (20 pages if more than one author are SGN members) ;

- if the first author is not a SGN member, the pdf is free of charge, subject to the payment by the author of publishing expenses as applied to non-members — see here above.

Author's rights / copyright

In all cases, if an illustration includes one or several elements that are not from the author him(her)self (as, e.g., a photograph or a drawing copied after another paper), the origin of this element or these elements must be clearly indicated (author, year, reference, publisher, copyright, etc.). In the same way, if part of a text coming from another paper or chapter of a book or an article posted on the World Wide Web is cited in the text, the origin of this part must be clearly indicated (author, year, reference, publisher, copyright, etc.).
